"I had a care package left on my porch today from a fan who left her initial as K," Lyon said. "It was four rolls of toilet paper, some candy bars, some tooth-paste, (of which I was almost out), and a bottle of wine. And some hand sanitizer and wipes. I am very grateful. But now I have 24 rolls of toilet paper because I had bought some and then re-bought some before this whole thing started, and then my cleaning lady had left me a 12 pack. I have more toilet paper than I need for a year. If anybody needs some, send me an email.

"I am fine. I hope all of the Jukes and all of the Juke fans are doing well. Hang in there and we will have a party as soon as possible.
